The goals set by the district for the 2021-2022 school year are:

- The percentage of students in grades K-2 performing at grade level equivalent or above as measured by district local assessment in ELA and Math: 85% in 2022, 90% in 2023.
- The percentage of students in grades 3-6 scoring Level 3 or 4 on Georgia Milestones EOG test in ELA: 95% of state average by 2022, 100% of state average by 2023.

Second grade will focus on expanding their knowledge in phonics to read for fluency and comprehension. Students will build fluency with addition and subtraction.
