What is Title I?

Spring Place Elementary is identified as a Title I Distinguished School as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging State academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement policy.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it? This is a plan that describes how Spring Place Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Spring Place Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Spring Place Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it developed? Spring Place Elementary School welcomes parent input and comments at any time regarding the plan. All parent feedback will be used to revise the plan for next year. We hold two meetings each year to gather input. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and post feedback throughout the year. We also distribute an annual survey sent home with students to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parent involvement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during our family night events throughout the school year.

Who is it for? All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Spring Place Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available? At the beginning of the year, the plan is given to all students. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center located in the media center and on our website.
